



DONALD WHITESIDE Ph. D.— 1931 - 1993

Anyone who has worked on the families "of Whiteside" history or genealogy will soon come across the work of Dr. Donald Whiteside of Nepean, (Ottawa), Ontario.

Donald was born to Thereon Harvey and Dorothy (Reid) Whiteside in Brooklyn, NY on May 19th of 1931. At the age of 16, Donald, joined the merchant marine. He joined the U.S. Army in 1948 and in the early 1950's, served in the U. S. Second Division in Korea. He remained in the army until 1954.

He graduated from the Wisconsin State University in 1958 with a B.S. This was followed at the same school by a M.S. in 1960.

He began his teaching career as an instructor at North Carolina State University in 1964/65. He became an Assistant Professor at the University of Tennessee in 1965-67.

He accepted a post teaching Sociology at the University of Alberta, Edmonton), from 1967 to 1970. He received his Doctorate, Ph. D., from Stanford University in 1967; his specialty was Sociology.

Donald married Alvina Helen Adams on 11 Feb., 1956. They lived in Nepean, Ontario, until the time of his death on November 22, 1993. They had 5 children, Scott Douglas, Natasha Ann, Kent Alexander, James Adams and Thomas Reid.

Warren Whiteside's Recollections of the Origins of the WFA

In 2000 I retired and had been reading about the availability of yDNA testing for establishing long lost family links. I was intrigued, even though it cost \$249 to have an analysis done on 12 sampling loci. I was early retired and not getting full pension income so cost was a consideration. There was also another consideration. I needed another random Whiteside with whom to compare. I scoured the internet and left messages trying to interest another Whiteside. Enter Wally Whiteside of British Columbia. He agreed to participate and compare his sample to mine. Such was the start of the Whiteside yDNA project. A little more than a year later along came G. Elliott Whitesides and soon after came Norris Whiteside.

Before all this, I was also trying to find what documented family history. I had met William R. Whiteside via the internet earlier, and he had told me of an Alan Whiteside who was custodian of Don's work.

In 2000, myself and Dennis D. Whiteside transcribed and proofed some Whiteside source documents. The first was the Pennsylvania census. I began what was to become the Whiteside CD and was attempting to enlist help - I do not know how to type. With William R. Whiteside came Sandra Whiteside Trapp and Rebecca Hansen, who eventually transcribed and proofed the bulk of the source documents I obtained from Alan Whiteside, who was living in Florida.

Once G. Elliott Whitesides saw that he and I were matches in the summer of 2002, he showed up at my door here, outside of Odessa.

Later he would propose getting everyone (in the FTDNA project) together at a later date at his home in Kingston. That actually happened in September of 2003 after 23 more participants had joined the yDNA project.

Oh, what a special time that was at Kingston. These very distant cousins (Barbara J. Whiteside from UK) speaking and listening to what sounded like dreams. One of those dreams was an online Whiteside Genealogical Library. It was here that I knew none of these dreams would come true without a vehicle. I spoke in private about this with Norris Whiteside as my new found cousin, Larry Wayne Whiteside, listened intently and nodded in agreement. Now all that was needed was action to go with those words.

Coincidentally, about this same time, my Kivett cousins were in the midst of forming a North Carolina based Kivett Family corporation. That was it !!! If those of Whiteside would agree to support a family corporation, then I would undertake this task.

Sadly, some refused to be involved as officers while others said they would. The final outcome was that Barbara J. Whiteside had agreed to serve as President while Douglas Whiteside (now deceased) said he would fill the Vice President slot. Larry Wayne Whiteside would be Treasurer and Sandra Trapp had agreed to be Secretary, if I couldn't find anyone else willing and able.

I made my trip to Dover and paid to file an application for incorporation. The application was accepted a week or so later and the WFA was official! Larry Wayne Whiteside had obtained an EIN number, and I started looking into formal IRS recognition as a 501(c) 3 corporation. By March of 2004, I began the IRS process of applying for approval and by that summer Sandra Trapp had made a contact with Barbara Stone, who had Whiteside lineage and wanted to help.

In September of 2004, I had succeeded in obtaining 501(c) 3 status and arrangements were made by Sandra Trapp to gather at Barbara and Ernie Stone's very large second home at North

Vernon, Indiana. Barbara's husband, Ernie, was a CPA and shocked to see that I had gotten IRS approval in the short time of 6 months. He was also pleased because this would allow him to make a few extra deductions on his taxes.

By now the yDNA project had 33 participants (as of today=70) with no signs of stopping. The gathering at the Stones was successful in no small part because of the involvement of Barbara Stone's twin sister, Beverly Massey. I often recall her and what she unselfishly did. This is where I first met Robert L. Whiteside. He had received his yDNA numbers in November of 2003 and then volunteered <g> to run a WFA web site.

One of my first acts as the second President of the WFA was to enlist Robert L. Whiteside as WFA webmaster. He became more than webmaster.

At that same gathering, our Joseph K. Whiteside proposed we create and adopt our own family crest. Jointly, he and Norris Whiteside work on this task. which culminated in presentation of a WFA flag at our 2009 Branson gathering to President William G. Whiteside. Joseph K. Whiteside and Ruby Whiteside Leighton also organized a wonderful trip to Antrim which included many Whiteside place names.

BTW, it was Bill R. who had made me aware of Alan Whiteside being "keeper" of Don's stuff. Upon learning of that, I made an effort to contact and solicit Alan to share. Alan responded positively and met me in Virginia with the first box of Don's records.

The time period of 2003-2004 was an extremely busy one on many fronts including continued contact with Alan Whiteside . What a great guy. He, unselfishly, had been custodian of Don's considerable source records for years, which I now find includes lineage charts in binders. I am amazed, because it hits me that these charts are the conclusions Don drew from his source materials.

After that I made two (or three) trips to Alan in FL to obtain addition stuff and return earlier boxes. I had asked Elliott to make that last trip to Alan as I could not. He wanted to make sure that I had all of Don's stuff. It was after that trip that I gave Elliott what I had from Alan (chart books,etc) Until then I had it all.

About this time, there was a meeting of the interim Board of Directors at Norris Whiteside's home in Atlanta. I took some of the charts to this meeting, but no one seemed interested in them; so I took them back to Delaware and waited for our next gathering to be held once again at the Stones vacation home in Indiana. I again took Don's charts and now there was interest enough that it was decided to copy them (for safety). That didn't happen right away, but in the meanwhile, Sandra Trapp was working on submitting Don's work to the Allen County Public Library at Ft. Wayne, Indiana. Copies needed to be made. We had a director's meeting there and Sandra Trapp gave her report of progress. Another plateau has been reached thanks to her work and diligence.

Our G. Elliott Whitesides obtained the remainder of Don's records from Alan Whiteside and is curator of them at his home in Kingston. Sandra Trapp and William R. Whiteside have inventoried these holdings and now all of Don's source materials have been transcribed in a format easily shared via the WFA web site.

William R. Whiteside's Recollections of the Origins of the WFA

As far as the first meeting goes I remember that most of our time was spent getting to know one another, which in retrospect wasn't a bad idea.

How did I hear about the meeting? I think Elliott told me that some folks were getting together and invited me to attend.

My reason for attending? Curiosity, because I wanted to see what they had in mind, and because having a group of folks, although not necessarily a formal group, interested in Whitesides seemed like a good idea.

The meeting was what I expected, but not necessarily what I would have preferred. My preference was for a more structured type meeting because I am not by nature a very sociable type of person, although I feel like I made some life-long friends there.

Despite some initial skepticism on my part, the group has shown considerable growth over the years and what they have done since the first meeting is actually pretty amazing. I hope they can continue to attract folks interested in Whiteside history who will want to maintain the organization for years to come.

As far as Don's collection is concerned, I don't think it matters what happens to the originals once the material has been scanned. Much of his source material being made available on the internet, but it is nice to have it all in one place.

As far as Don's charts are concerned, no one should use them as anything other than a strawman. In the same light, there are very few family trees/histories/genealogies on the internet that offer any kind of documentation.

Barbara J. Whiteside's Recollections of the Origins of the WFA

This is my recollection of the run up to and the first Whiteside gathering of Whitesides at Kingston Tennessee in 2003.

My first communication with the American Whiteside folk was with Sandra Whiteside Trapp about the year 2000. She helped me with some Irish American ancestors and I helped her with her Lancashire ancestors whenever I could. Through her I was put in touch with Warren and at some point there was a discussion about the possibility of a Whiteside gathering. It was primarily to discuss what to do with all the materials of Don Whitesides held by Warren and Elliott. Well this snowballed into the subsequent gathering at Elloit's home in Kingston Tennessee.

I remember Warren's first words when introduced to me. " How you doin' LIMEY??" And I STILL love him!!!!!!

Next morning we all gathered and sat round in a circle in a huge room on the lower level of the house. We each had to introduce ourselves and tell something about ourselves. I remember being very nervous when it came to my turn, but this was the moment I had dreamed of for a long time. I introduced myself and told everyone straight away that I had come to this meeting to try to realise a dream and to try and found a Whiteside Family Association of some sorts.

I am happy to say that the idea was taken on board by everybody, discussed at great length, and that, in a nut shell, was the founding of our wonderful WFA. So much else was achieved at that meeting.

I have purposely left out all the wonderful camaraderie and laughter, not forgetting the truly wonderful hospitality of Elliott and Jo Ann shown to us all at that meeting. My most moving memory was of Doug. Sitting quietly in the corner of the porch enjoying every moment. A very quiet man of few words, but he suddenly came out with something like " As a Whiteside, I always felt so alone until now. Now I have a family." It makes me cry even now thinking about it, and his words alone were worth the long journey for me.

G. Elliott Whitesides – Kingston, Tennessee

Norris Whiteside and I had corresponded for some time. When I matched Warren's yDNA, I immediately called Norris and asked him to submit a yDNA sample to confirm the family connection that I saw, on paper, between the two of us. So, that is how he came to be involved as the meeting was planned.

I had met Bill, the artist, through Norris. The two of them had conversed about our genealogy over the years as Norris visited the mountain area where Bill had his gallery. I had visited Bill several times and copied some of his data on the 1000 family.

Joe S. Whiteside was a friend of Bill Whiteside, the artist. I don't recall meeting him before our gathering. So, I assume he learned of the meeting from Bill.

My impression is that Doug Whiteside, Larry Wayne Whiteside, and Joe K. Whiteside learned of the meeting from Warren.

During the meeting, I found that Doug had a very good friend that had grown up in the small textile community in which I had lived in North Carolina. One more small world story.

I just remember fondly about how all these people whom I had not met showed up, and what a rewarding time that was for me.

One interesting note, as you may recall, I sent a note to everyone who was coming and asked them not to discuss politics. This was prompted by conversations that I had had with one of the attendees and was aware that he liked to talk politics and wasn't very tactful, if you disagreed with him. During the meeting one of the attendees talked with me privately and told me of his political stance, indicating that he really had no use for anyone who was aligned with the other party. I think that we would have had a fight if a political discussion had arisen. I was really glad I had sent the note.

I am glad that you all are putting together notes about the gatherings. My memory has never been very good so your efforts will allow me to have a written memory of the meeting.

People who attended the initial meeting in Kingston, Tennessee, at the home of Jo Ann and Elliott Whitesides on September 6 and 7, 2003, were asked to provide their thoughts on that first meeting. The following is what some of them wrote.

Larry Wayne Whiteside, Dayton Beach, Florida

I heard about the meeting from Warren Whiteside. I attended because I was interested in the Whiteside family and thought the gathering was great! I will always remember our get together. I miss you all.

Esther Whiteside, Cashiers, North Carolina

Elliott & Jo Ann Whitesides came to our home and wanted to see the Whiteside records that we had and recorded everything we had. We visited, had lunch and talked some more. Wonderful time.

Elliott later called and said they would like to have a meeting with some Whiteside people at their home and invited us and Joe & Ida Whiteside to come. All four of us went there and stayed in Jo Ann and Elliott's guest house. There were about 24 or 25 of us. They boarded and fed all of us except Norris. He stayed in a hotel.

We all exchanged our knowledge of the family. Had a good time visiting and Elliott took all of us on his boat to see the beautiful lake they live on. They had also built this very large house themselves. She did all the cooking and the food was great.

We did a lot of planning - found out who could do what and decided to continue. From there things really took off and Whiteside Family Association was on its way.

Joseph S. Whiteside, Salem, South Carolina

I had known Bill and Esther Whiteside for some time. He told me some of the Whitesides were going to get together. I got a copy of the email Elliott sent saying we could meet at his house in Tennessee.

I wanted to know more about my family. I had some information that Don Whiteside had left with me. Father and I found some interesting things in them and wanted to know more.

The meeting was more than I expected. Meeting family and getting to more about the past of some of my cousins.

I don't do research the way some of you do, but I am truly glad for times we have spent together.

Norris Whiteside, Atlanta, Georgia

Warren and I talked about it having a Whiteside gathering, and I wished to be a part of the WFA.

I had worked with Don Whiteside and wanted to continue to be part of what would come.

The meeting was better than I had expected or hoped for. Lots of interest, good turn-out. Plans were made that are still effective today.

I have been able to attend most of the meetings. All have been worthwhile and produced results (look at the paid membership). We have the best possible officers, and I believe we will continue to grow and help Whiteside cousins (as Warren calls us) world wide.

I believe what we have accomplished is mostly the result of the fine work by the builders of the WFA web site. We have a strong base (world wide). Look at our fine first president, and the great meeting done by David Whiteside. Much credit is also given to the work, lots of it, done by Bob Whiteside.

Sandra Whiteside Trapp, Hinsdale, Illinois

I was subscribed to the RootsWeb Whiteside mailing list and saw Warren's e-mail about the gathering. I had been corresponding with Barbara Whiteside in Fleetwood, England for some time, and she told me she planned to attend. Elliott and JoAnn were very gracious hosts. I wasn't sure what would be accomplished with this meeting, but Warren's initiative in getting the 501(c)3 status and Larry obtaining an EIN established the WFA as a viable organization; and our presence on the internet with all its resources has made membership in the WFA worthwhile.

**E-Mail Sent from Elliott Whitesides to Terry Whiteside
After the Founders Meeting**

Terry,

Well, the gathering of Whiteside's has come and gone. We had 16 visitors from across the country along with the lady from England. One of the guest's was a fellow from California who emigrated from Ireland in 1956 to California. He and I match yDNA, 25 out of 25 markers, indicating that we surely are kin.

I think that everyone had a great time. After 15 minutes it seemed as if we had known each other for years.

We did not make as much progress on the agenda as I would have liked but we, at least, made a start.

Among the topics we discussed were:

We are considering forming a corporation, with a charter to receive and compile information about our family. I am not quite sure just where this might lead but several attendees thought this would be worthwhile. Warren will be looking at this.

A number of us brought our collection of documents, artifacts, and other items for exhibit. A William (Bill) Whiteside, Cottage Hills, IL, brought samples of his great collection of information about the family. He is a former college professor who talked often with Don Whiteside about Don's work before Don's death. While I am not sure how much he communicated with your Dad, he is very knowledgeable about his work.

We spent much time discussing just what we might do with the various collections of paperwork and artifacts that we each have. We discussed the experience of Don Whiteside's family upon his death. Don thought that he had an agreement with a library to accept his work. When his wife tried to transfer the collection to the library, they declined. At this point, a fellow from Atlanta agreed to take the material. My understanding is that the material filled at least one tractor-trailer load. My attempts to communicate with this fellow have not been very successful even though he has shared some of his material with Warren Whiteside, who has been heading the yDNA effort in our family. He evidently went through a very painful divorce and is now living in Florida. Part of the material is there and the rest is in a warehouse in Atlanta. To make matters worse, he had his yDNA tested and has found that he is not a Whiteside. He is devastated. We don't know exactly where or how this occurred although in one e-mail he says that he supposes that he has known this for thirty years.

All of this brings a great urgency to finding some place for collecting and storing all of our family's data and artifacts. We went away with a charge to try to find a solution.

Another item was the need to produce a GEDCOM file for the data collected by Don Whiteside. One of the attendees has agreed to evaluate the amount of effort to do this and report back. Your Dad's work is so much more valuable now that it is in a GEDCOM file. For example, we just received a note from one of your cousins asking if we can help him find his kinship among the Whiteside family. Using the file I see that he is your half-uncle Horace Sr.'s, son, Horace Jr. He was aware of your Dad's work only to the extent that he said that 'Foster' had 'spent many years on the family information and made many long lists of family.' It is a small world.

The last item dealt with the GEDCOM file that you shared with me. While we haven't come to a final conclusion about how this work might be protected, one participant, a Sandra Whiteside Trapp, who spends much of her retirement time researching her particular genealogy, suggested that the best method might be to submit the file to the Mormon library as a Pedigree Resource File. This would assure that the original file would not be altered while at the same time allowing individuals to take the basic data and add their own continuing family data for their own use. I will be looking more into this by stopping by a local Mormon Family History Center and talking with them. You might also talk with someone who is knowledgeable about this.

Several questions did arise about your GEDCOM file that I did not know the answer to. Perhaps you can provide answers. The questions were:

Is the data on the file the same as that on file in the Clayton Genealogical Library? Or, does the file contain additional material?

Col. Moore was working with both your Dad and Don. Is he still alive? Did he add to your Dad's work after your Dad's death? Did he prepare the GEDCOM file that you shared with me? If so, would we need his agreement before possibly putting the data on file with the Mormon's? If Col. Moore did prepare the GEDCOM file, is he perhaps preparing a GEDCOM file of Don's work?

Whew! This turned out to be longer than I expected. We would appreciate your response on our questions regarding the GEDCOM file.

HOW THE WFA ACQUIRED DON WHITESIDE'S RESEARCH PAPERS

It was told to Elliott Whitesides that Alan Whiteside had been corresponding with Don when Don passed away. Alan was told by Don's family that they wanted to get rid of all the research materials that Don had accumulated. Alan agreed to take the information, and Don's son drove it in a semi-trailer truck to Alan's home. However, Alan didn't know what to do with it. At some point, Alan went to his local library in Marietta, Georgia, and asked if they wanted some of the information. They agreed to take the Illinois materials.

Bill R. Whiteside had made Warren Whiteside aware that Alan had Don's research, so Warren contacted Alan about acquiring it for copying/transcribing, which was the start of the transcribing for the Whiteside CD (pre WFA). Alan met Warren at a gas station just off of I95 north of Richmond, Virginia, where Alan gave Warren some of the materials.

Later on, Warren made a trip to West Palm Beach with Bobbie (Warren's wife) to visit with her elder sister; and he took two days to go over to see Alan near Tampa (Port St Richey). He wanted to return the first box and get additional material. At that time, Alan and Warren talked about some charts that were amongst Don's materials. They were more than Warren could take, so he made a plan to go back just prior to the WFA director's meeting in Atlanta at Norris Whiteside's house.

Warren made the second trip to Alan's, and he took a sample of those charts to that meeting. All to no avail; no one was interested. He ended up taking them back home with him as no one seemed to see them as important. Not to be discouraged, he took some of the chart books to the second gathering at Barbara and Ernie Stone's house in Indiana. This time Bill R. Whiteside had a chance to see these, and he reacted accordingly.

Warren wanted to go back to Alan's again, but he was having medical issues, etc; so he asked Elliott Whitesides if he could go to Alan's from Lake Placid (Elliott lives there in the winter) and retrieve what was left.

When Elliott Whitesides found out that Alan had Don's research papers, he asked if Alan would make a copy of what he had and send them to him. Alan asked Warren to give him Elliott's email address so he could tell him just how much there was.

Elliott Whitesides went to the home of Alan Whiteside in Port Richey, Florida. Alan wanted Elliott to come back some other day, but Elliott was prepared to stay. Eventually, Alan took Elliott to the storage shed and showed him Don Whiteside's research. Elliott gathered everything into garbage bags and boxes and filled the bed of his truck. Elliott brought back what Warren had returned along with the rest of the materials. We all owe a great debt to Alan because he cared for what Don had accumulated in Whiteside records.

Bob Whitside said that Don had planned to leave everything to the University of Illinois because Don thought this was where the greatest population of Whiteside families lived.

Alan told Elliott that amongst the materials he received of Don's work, there was a large quantity of index cards, about 50,000; but he didn't know what to do with them, so he threw them away. We now know they were the Whiteside cards that Don had created. These cards were cards for each individual with a Whiteside surname and showed an ahnentafel number for each person.

Elliott had asked Norris Whiteside about the non-Whiteside cards and Norris said Don had given them to him; but Norris gave them to Bill. Bill Whiteside (the artist) in Cashiers, North Carolina, had the non-Whiteside cards, as well as the the masters of Don's publications. Bill lives in an old church and Elliott went there to find those cards. Bill let him search the storage area where Elliott found about 5,000 of the cards.

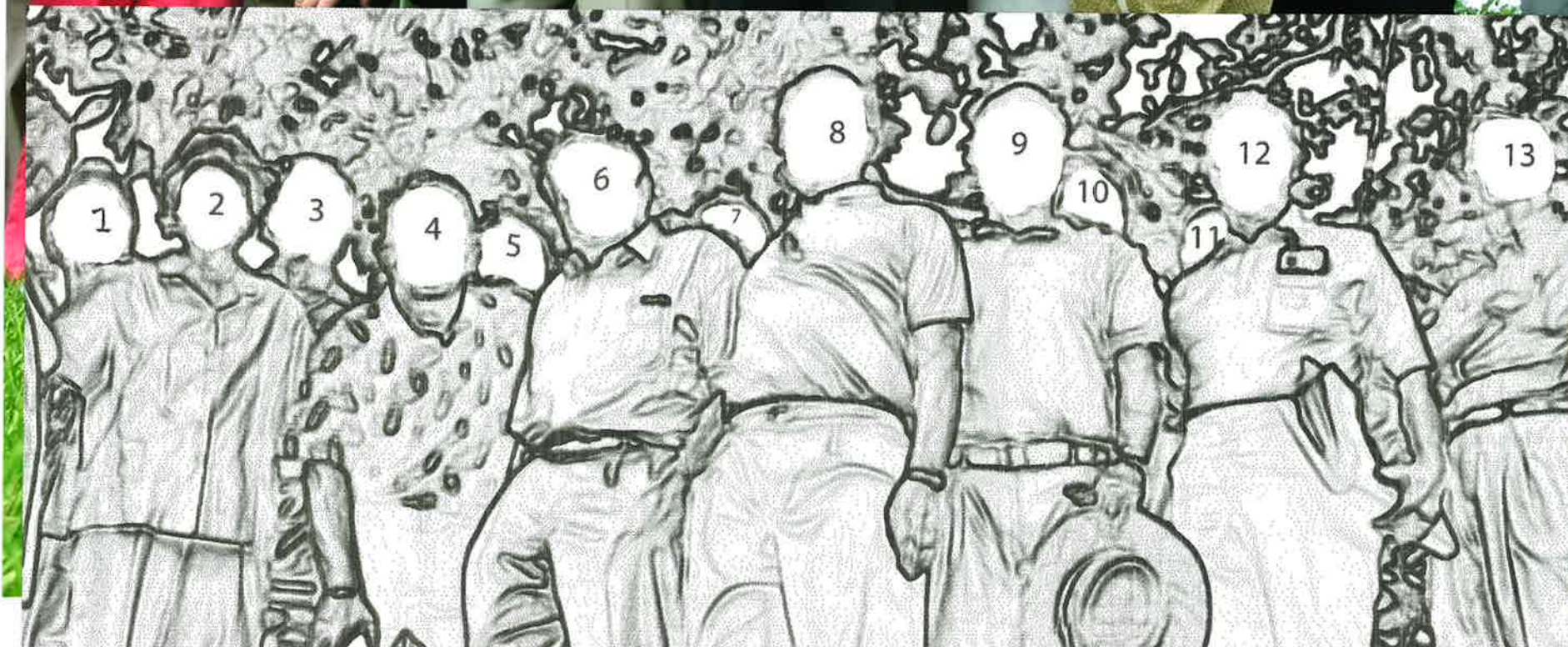
